Food Bank Sunday July 7, 2019

"If you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness. -- Isaiah 58:10 (NRSV)

We continue to request your support of the Northeast Iowa Food Bank by donating non-perishable food and non-food items and money through the church. The first Sunday of the month, July 7th, will be designated "Food Bank Sunday".

The Northeast Iowa Food Bank's 2019 Personal Care Drive runs from Monday, July 1st, through Monday, August 12th. Many of the same families that struggle with food insecurity also struggle to provide personal care items for their families. No access to those items lead to poor hygiene, health issues among both adults and children, and damage to a family's well-being. Items needed for the Personal Care Drive are soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, and diapers.

There is a container in the entryway for your donations of food and non-food items. If you prefer to give a monetary donation, make your check payable to the church with a notation that it is for the Food Bank. Your donation will show on your statement of giving to the church.

For every \$10.00 the food bank receives, they can provide approximately 40 meals. Your donations do make a difference. Can you help this month?






Make Egyptian Paper Beads

The people of Egypt have been making beads for 5000 years!

You will need:

- Brightly colored magazine pages
- Yarn
- Metal washers, buttons or macaroni (optional)
- Paintbrush handle
- Glue
- Scissors

How to make:

- 1. Cut magazine pages into 1" strips.
- 2. Spread glue on each strip. Lay the paintbrush handle at the end of the strip. Roll it up around the handle.
- 3. Pull the brush handle out. Let beads dry.
- 4. When dry, string beads on yarn. Add metal washers, buttons or macaroni if you'd like.
